

Student Learning Outcomes for the Master's in Applied Behavior Analysis are as follows:

The overarching goal of the program is for students to complete the necessary coursework and supervised practicum hours to sit for the BCBA certificate exam. Earning the BCBA certification is not a requirement of the program, but all elements of the program prepare students so that they may become certified.

1. Demonstrate effective communication with professionals both in and outside of the field of Applied Behavior Analysis.
2. Master and apply behavioral techniques for assessment, functional analysis and behavior intervention.
3. Demonstrate knowledge of and appropriate use of single-subject research designs.
4. For a specific behavior, conduct a comprehensive literature review, design a project, collect and summarize data and relate findings to literature.
