* The mean, or average, is calculated by summing the values from all reporting institutions and then dividing by the number of reporting institutions. The median value is the observation that is in the middle of the set or the value that divides the set in half where 50% of the values are equal to or greater than the median and 50% are less. The median becomes useful when examining a set containing extreme values that greatly affect the mean.

** Except for Total Dormitory Capacity and Percent Receiving Financial Aid (which are ranked highest to lowest), rankings are based on the notion that lowest costs receive highest ranking. For example, YSU's \$8,356 out-of-state tuition is the lowest in the data set and therefore receives a ranking of #1.
