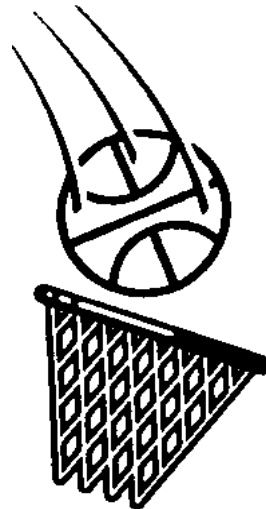

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## **Introduction**

Team and/or individual registrations can be submitted to the Andrews Student Recreation and Wellness Center Administrative Office, Room 2018, 11am - 8pm (M-F).

The intramural staff encourages your suggestions and invites everyone to stop in or call to inquire about any services provided. We look forward to seeing you in the near future.



## Sports Entry

**Entry forms:** A team captain must sign up all team members using the Symplicity website. Each registration will require the name of the participant, the patron or student ID number, and phone number. Please remember that a player may play for only one team. Be sure to check your eligibility before signing up. The \$10 team fee is payable at the Andrews Student Recreation and Wellness Center, Room 2018.

**Mandatory captains' meeting:** Attendance at the captains' meeting is required. Rules, schedules, and possible play-offs will be covered at this meeting.

**Individual, dual tournament sports, and one- and two-day tournaments:** These sports do not require the \$10 fee. Registrations will still be made using Symplicity, prior to the deadline date.

If you want to compete, but are not able to organize a team, inquire at the Intramural Office and we will assist you in finding a team to join.

## Intramural Sports Advisory Board

The Intramural Sports Advisory Board serves in an advisory capacity to the Coordinator of Intramural Sports and consists of undergraduate students. Students who are interested in serving on the board are interviewed by the Coordinator of Intramural Sports. Board members are appointed during fall semester and serve for one academic year. Specific duties of the board are:

1. To assist and advise the administration of the Intramural Sports program.
2. To develop and recommend policies and procedures to the Coordinator.
3. To promote interest within the Intramural Sports program.
4. To serve as a "sounding board" for students attending YSU in all matters pertaining to the Intramural Sports program.
5. To rule on appeals related to disciplinary decisions made by the Intramural Sports staff.

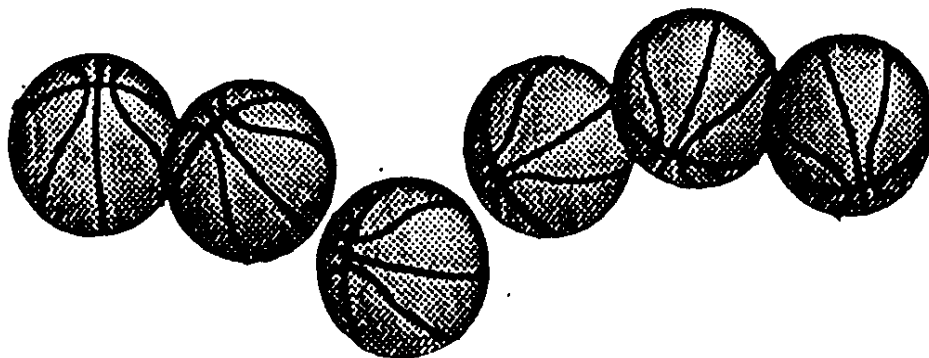


## Duties and Responsibilities of Team Captains

The success of the Intramural Sports program depends largely on the leadership qualities and interests of team captains.

1. Each team must have a captain or representative responsible for the coordination between players and the Intramural Sports program. Experience has proven that teams contending for top honors usually have alert and efficient team captains.
2. Some of the team captain's duties are:
  - a. Submit the required information for each member of his/her team on an official team roster. The online roster and the \$10 non-refundable team fee are due on the registration due date.
  - b. Find the team schedule online and notify team members of all scheduled games: date, location, and time. **It is the captain's responsibility to have his/her team ready to play, as scheduled. All players must have a proper YSU ID at each contest.** Information concerning date, location, and time of contests will not be given via telephone by Intramural Sports staff.
  - c. Be familiar with all (eligibility and game) rules and see that his/her team is aware of those rules.
  - d. Make an effort to see that those representing his/her team play according to the rules of the game and conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner.
  - e. Notify Intramural Sports whenever his/her team must default a contest.
  - f. Check team roster often during the tournament, and especially prior to playoffs, to assure the eligibility of his/her team members.
  - g. Receive all correspondence from Intramural Sports concerning changes in rules, tournament structure, ineligible players, team conduct at contests, etc.
  - h. Inform the Intramural Sports Office immediately of any change of address, telephone number, or change in team captain.
  - i. **KEEP IN CLOSE CONTACT WITH THE INTRAMURAL SPORTS STAFF FOR PERTINENT INTRAMURAL SPORTS INFORMATION.**
  - j. Maintain control over his/her team members and spectators before, during, and after competition. Team sportsmanship will be in effect. Poor sportsmanship will result in elimination from the tournament and/or playoffs.

Note: The captain is the only individual allowed to approach an official during any contest regarding questions, rule clarifications, protests, etc.



## Regulations, Eligibility Exceptions, and Restrictions

1. Alumni are not eligible to participate in Intramural Sports activities.
2. Participants who have professional sports ratings are not eligible to participate in the sport of their rating or a similar intramural sport.
3. Former Olympic or National team members may not participate in the sport of their specialty or similar intramural sport until four years have lapsed since their last Olympic or National team experience.
4. Current varsity athletes are individuals whose names appear on a team roster or eligibility list of an intercollegiate athletic team at YSU or any four- year institution (to include transfer students). They may not participate in a similar intramural sport during the academic year in which they are so listed.
5. Intercollegiate athletes (this year) who have been red shirted or who have become academically ineligible are not eligible to participate in a similar intramural sport during the academic year in which they are so listed.
6. Participants who are considered former intercollegiate athletes (affiliated as an intercollegiate team member at a four-year institution) are eligible to participate in a similar intramural sport event limiting one per team following their last intercollegiate affiliation. **Exception:** Former intercollegiate athletes in individual specialty sports (i.e., swimming/diving, cross country, track and field, wrestling, tennis, and golf) are also not eligible to compete in a similar intramural sports event until one academic year following their last intercollegiate affiliation. However, these individuals may participate as “Exhibition Only” the year immediately following their previous affiliation, with the approval of the Coordinator of Intramural Sports and only when such opportunities are applicable.
7. A participant is not eligible to compete in an Intramural Sports event unless all pertinent information is provided on the appropriate entry form, team roster, or layer addition form.
8. A participant who falsifies or deletes pertinent information (full legal name, YSU student ID number) on an entry form, team roster, player addition, or score sheet is not eligible to participate in the respective Intramural Sports event.
9. A participant who has been suspended from participating in a sport is not eligible to take part in that intramural sport for the period of the suspension.
10. A participant is not eligible to play on more than one Intramural Sports team in the same sport or in more than one division within an individual/dual event. **Exception:** An individual may participate on both a men’s team and a co-rec team or a women’s team and a co-rec team. Furthermore, a participant is not permitted to transfer from one team to another after attending one scheduled game.

Note: Roster players need to play in one regular season game to be eligible for the playoffs.



## Penalties for Eligibility Infraction

1. Any team playing a player under another teammate's name will be charged with a "loss" for that game. The player will be ineligible to participate in the remainder of the sport tournament, and the team will be ineligible for the post-season playoffs.
2. Any team playing an ineligible player (not registered on the roster) who is detected following the contest in which the ineligible player participated, the ineligible player will not be allowed to participate in any further games without completing a player addition form, and the game will result in an automatic loss. If the use of an ineligible player is detected during the Campus Championship Playoffs, the last offended team will advance in playoff competition.
3. Due to the use of a computer system, any names misspelled or ID numbers incorrectly written may result in the ineligibility of the individual. Team rosters and player addition forms must be legible and accurate, or the computer will declare the individual to be ineligible.

## Player Additions

Additional team members may be added up to the Campus Championship Playoffs, but no new players may be added during any playoffs. The computerized team member list will be final. All participants must be officially added to the team roster. Participants should add new players via Symplicity, preferably before the date of the game. Each new player must complete the addition on the computer team list by adding new players on Symplicity. Note: Any player found to be participating on two teams will be suspended from the tournament. The second team using this player will be charged with a loss.



## Unsportsmanlike Behavior

No participant, spectator, or team follower shall at anytime:

- Use foul or derogatory language or threaten or verbally abuse any other participant or intramural employee before, during, or after an activity. This includes trash talk and taunting.
- Argue or talk back to a game official or supervisor. Only the team captain may address the official in a courteous manner concerning the interpretation of a rule.
- Intentionally strike, push, trip, or otherwise physically assault another player or employee or instigate or be involved in any fighting. Defense is not an excuse for fighting.
- Mistreat the facility, equipment, or supplies of YSU.
- Bring in alcohol or illegal drugs or attend any intramural event under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
- Leave the bench/viewing area to participate in any isolated altercation.
- A warning letter is a notification from Intramural Sports that indicates that an individual or team has exhibited undesirable behavior at an Intramural contest, and if such behavior is evident at any time in the future, suspension will result.

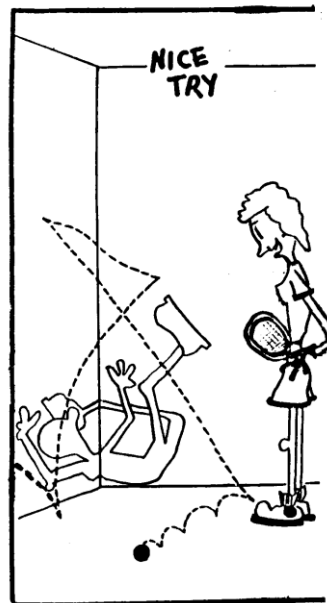
## Disciplinary Reporting Process

1. Officials and supervisors are empowered to eject a player or suspend a contest whenever deemed necessary.
2. Individuals or teams displaying undesirable behavior are to be reported by the officials to the supervisor/intern on duty.
3. The official will circle the name of the player on the scoresheet and indicate on the scoresheet the reason for the disciplinary action.
4. The supervisor will submit a written report to the Coordinator of Intramural Sports. An incident report will be completed for all cases involving ejection from a game.
5. In all instances involving undesirable behavior, the Coordinator of Intramural Sports will notify the offending individual. All letters involving suspension will be mailed with return receipt requested.
6. The Coordinator of Intramural Sports will review the information provided by the supervisor and the game officials and will assess the disciplinary action deemed appropriate.
7. For all instances involving suspension, a Student Relations Disciplinary report will be sent to the Student Life Office to be placed in the student's university file. Further action may be taken by the Student Life Office. Individuals will be informed by Intramural Sports if a Student Life Disciplinary report has been placed in their file.
8. For all instances involving suspensions, the student or team will be entitled to an appeal if desired. Appeals may be directed to the Intramural Sports Advisory Board.
9. All letters and reports will be kept on file in the Intramural Sports Office for at least five years.



## Appeal Procedure

1. The appeal must be made in writing within three days following the date of the letter informing the individual or team of the suspension. An appeal form, obtainable at the Intramural Office, Stambaugh Sports Complex, Room 1052, must be submitted to Intramural Sports and must be accompanied by a letter expressing the reasons for the appeal.
2. A date and time for the appeal hearing will be arranged by Intramural Sports. The hearing will be arranged as quickly as possible following receipt of the request for an appeal hearing.
3. The appeal may be directed to the three-member subcommittee of the Intramural Sports Advisory Board.
4. All parties involved in the incident will be asked to attend the appeal hearing (officials, graduate assistants, undergraduate assistants, victim, and the suspended individual or team captain). Those individuals not able to attend the hearing may be interviewed via the telephone.
5. As a result of the hearing, the appeal may be:
  - a. Denied, or
  - b. Upheld. Should the appeal be upheld, the penalty imposed by the Coordinator of Intramural Sports will be either lessened or dismissed completely.
6. As a result of the hearing, the subcommittee or the coordinator may request that the Student Life Disciplinary report be removed from the file of the individual.
7. A letter indicating the result of the appeal hearing will be sent to the appealing individual or team by either the chairperson of the subcommittee of the Intramural Sports Advisory Board or by the Coordinator of Intramural Sports. A copy of the letter will be sent to the Student Life Office and to the Coordinator of Intramural Sports.
8. The individual or team requesting the appeal should be aware that only one appeal may be made, with the decision of the subcommittee being final.



## Penalties for Specific Infractions (Individuals)

1. Player participates under an assumed name.
  - a. Ejected immediately by official or supervisor and suspended from remainder of specific sport season
  - b. Second time reported: suspended from all Intramural activities for one calendar year
  - c. Third time reported: permanent suspension
2. Player uses abusive language toward official, opponent, or teammate.
  - a. Can be ejected immediately by official or supervisor
  - b. Warning letter sent for first infraction
  - c. Second time reported: two-game suspension
  - d. Third time reported: suspended from tournament
3. Player uses unnecessary roughness.
  - a. Can be ejected immediately by official or supervisor
  - b. Warning letter sent for first infraction
  - c. Second time reported: two-game suspension
  - d. Third time reported: suspended from tournament
4. Player attempts to incite a fight.
  - a. Can be ejected immediately by official or supervisor
  - b. Second time: suspended from tournament
  - c. Third time: suspended for semester
5. Player hits or fights with an opponent, teammate, or spectator (swing at, hit, push, wrestle, or punch).
  - a. Immediate ejection by official or supervisor
  - b. Suspended from all Intramural activities for at least one semester (if offense is severe, can be suspended)
  - c. Second time: suspended for one calendar year
  - d. Third time: permanent suspension
6. Player hits an official or supervisor.
  - a. Immediate ejection by officials or supervisor
  - b. Permanently suspended from all Intramural activities for remaining of YSU experience (A letter will be sent to the YSU Student Judicial Discipline Board for University Sanctions.)
7. Player grabs or pushes an official or supervisor.
  - a. Immediate ejection by officials or supervisor
  - b. Suspended from all Intramural activities for one calendar year and can be permanently suspended. (No warning letter will be sent.)
  - c. Second time: permanent suspension
8. Player is continually abusive throughout the game and/or after being ejected by official or supervisor.
  - a. Suspended for at least 2 games. (No warning will be sent.)
  - b. Second time: suspended from all Intramural activities for one semester
  - c. Third time: suspended from all Intramural activities for one calendar year
9. Player verbally or physically threatens a teammate or opponent.
  - a. Can be ejected immediately by officials or supervisor
  - b. Letter sent for first infraction and at least a two-game suspension
  - c. Second time: suspended from tournament
  - d. Third time: suspended for one year
10. Player verbally or physically threatens an official or supervisor.
  - a. Can be ejected immediately by official or supervisor
  - b. Suspended from all Intramural Sports activities for remainder of semester
  - c. Second time: suspended for one calendar year
  - d. Third time: permanent suspension

11. Players are not ejected but are reported for undesirable behavior.
  - a. Warning letter sent
  - b. Second time: one-game suspension
  - c. Third time: two-game suspension
  - d. Fourth time: suspended from all Intramural activities for at least one semester

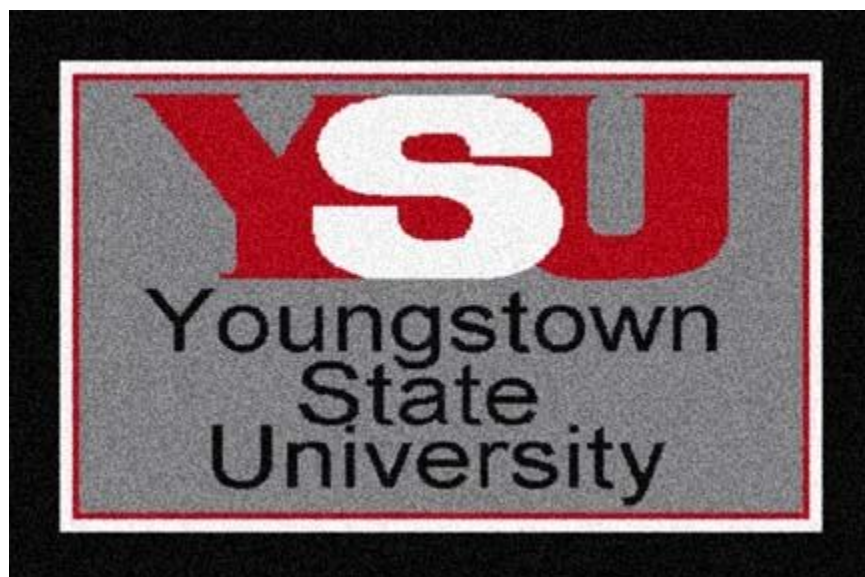
Players who, throughout their matriculation at YSU, display a pattern of undesirable behavior (reported at least 3 times) may receive more severe penalties, even if the infraction is the first of a particular tournament.

## Penalties for Specific Infractions (Team)

1. Team uses ineligible (suspended or participating under an assumed name) player(s).
  - a. First infraction: game immediately terminated; team receives automatic loss; team ineligible for playoff tournament
  - b. Second time: team dropped from tournament; team placed on permanent probation
2. Team uses abusive language toward official, opponent, or supervisor.
  - a. First time: warning letter sent indicating that next offense will result in being dropped from tournament
  - b. Second time: dropped from tournament
  - c. Third time: team players ineligible for Intramural activities for one semester
3. Team is unnecessarily rough.
  - a. Game can be forfeited by team
  - b. Warning letter for first infraction indicating that next offense will result in team being dropped from tournament
  - c. Second time: team dropped from tournament
  - d. Third time: team players ineligible for Intramural activities for 1 semester
4. Team fights with opponents (swing at, hit, wrestle, push, punch).
  - a. Game immediately terminated; both teams receiving loss
  - b. First infraction: team dropped from tournament; team placed on permanent probation; Student Life Disciplinary reports sent to Student Life Office; individuals identified will be dealt with in accordance with the regulations specified for individuals
  - c. Second time: permanent suspension for all players involved
5. Team hits, grabs, pushes, or threatens an official or supervisor.
  - a. Game immediately terminated; team receives automatic loss and dropped from tournament
  - b. First infraction: team placed on one- year suspension and permanent probation; Student Life Disciplinary reports sent to Student Life Office; individuals identified will be dealt with in accordance with the regulations specified for individuals
  - c. Second time: permanent suspension

**Automatic losses may not be appealed!**



## Protest Procedure

Protests will not be received or considered if they are based on a decision involving the accuracy of judgment on the part of the official (i.e., whether a player is “safe” or “out”, “fouled” or “not fouled”, etc.). The following procedure applies to all Intramural Sports team events:

1. Team captains must notify game officials that the game is being played under protest immediately following a discrepancy and/or rule misinterpretation. Team captains should insist that officials indicate notification of protest on the official score sheet. Also, the supervisor in charge must be notified at that time. Game time will be stopped during the interpretation of the protest.
2. The supervisor on duty will rule on all protests after gathering as much information as possible from the team captains and game officials. All protest decisions made by the supervisor will be final. If the protest is upheld, the error that has occurred will be rectified, and the game will continue. If the upheld protest involves player eligibility, the game will be terminated with the protesting team receiving the win.
3. Protests, other than eligibility, lodged after the completion of the contest or after one or more subsequent plays have elapsed will not be accepted.
4. Protests regarding player eligibility and protests involving a player participating under an assumed name must be made during the contest to the officials and/or intramural supervisor.
5. Upheld protests concerning player eligibility will result in the contest being forfeited by the offending team.
6. All protests will be ruled on by the Intramural Sports supervisor on duty. Protest rulings will consider all circumstances surrounding the protested discrepancy, not necessarily only a misinterpretation or incorrect ruling on the part of the official.



## Schedules

1. Schedules will be made with all rosters present at the time of deadline.
2. All participants and team captains are responsible for checking the schedules regularly during their sport season for exact play dates, times, and game locations. One copy of the team's schedule will be available to the team captain in the Intramural Sports Office 9:00am - 4:00pm, Monday - Friday.
3. On weekends, individuals should assume that games are being played. The official notice will be made by the supervisor in charge at the activity. Games will usually be played during showers or light rain.

## Requests Not to be Scheduled

1. Individuals and teams may request that they not be scheduled for particular days or times that may be inconvenient. Such requests must be written on the individual/dual entry form or on the bottom of the team roster at the time it is submitted. It should be noted that these are requests only and will be honored if at all possible. This will facilitate the first round of play only for individual/dual brackets and the league season for teams.
2. Such requests on team schedules cannot be honored during the Campus Championship Playoffs.

## Forfeits and Defaults

If a team or contestant is unable to play or fails to appear within ten minutes following a game's scheduled starting time, the supervisor will declare "win by forfeit" to the other team who meets the minimum number of players competing (on page 16). A forfeit counts as 1½ losses.

## Equipment Requirements

**Bottoms:** Cargo and jean pants or shorts are not permitted. For flag football only: pants and shorts with pockets are not permitted.

**Headwear:** Hats are not permitted. Players may wear a one-piece elastic headband made of a soft, pliable material (i.e, sleeve, sweatband). Knit stocking caps will be allowed in cold weather.

**Shoes:** Must be athletic shoes or tennis shoes. For flag football only: No metal cleats are permitted. For outdoor soccer only: only regulation soccer shoes or tennis shoes must be worn (molded one-piece sole).

**Other:** Casts are not permitted, and braces without proper protective covers are not permitted.



## Standards for All Intramural Leagues and Events

1. **Forfeit Rule:** The team that doesn't meet the minimum amount of players and is not ready to start when its 10 minutes after the start time **forfeits** the game.
2. All players must present a current YSU ID at all contests. ID's have to be collected by the team's captain and given to the referee at least 10 minutes before the start of the game. If a player comes late, the ID has to be given to the referee and then written down before that player is allowed to play.
3. Only the captain from each team is allowed to talk to the referees during play or at halftime. If a player other than the captain complains to the referees, a warning will be given to that team's captain. If it happens a second time during the same game, then that player will be ejected from the game.
4. In the case of an ejection, the player not only must leave the premises, but also needs to meet with the Assistant Director of Intramural Sports before she/he may participate in the next activity.
5. **THE INTRAMURAL STAFF HAS THE RIGHT TO STOP A CONTEST IF THEY DEEM IT NECESSARY.**
6. Any rules not covered in this rule sheet will be subject to interpretation by the Assistant Director for Intramural sports.
7. All contests will be supervised by an Intramural Supervisor/official. The Supervisor's/official's responsibilities will be to rule on any situation in which teams cannot agree. The Supervisor's/official's decisions are final and should not be questioned. The Supervisor/official will grade each team nightly in regards to sportsmanship
8. No smoking on the field areas, and no tobacco chewing on the field areas.

## All-Sports Scoring System (Men, Women, and Co-rec)

1. The team accumulating the greatest number of points throughout the year will be the All-Sports Champions. A champion will be declared in each league.
2. A team forfeiting more than one game will lose all participation points for that sport.
3. There will be a 20 point penalty for a forfeit in all team sports. If a playoff game is forfeited, the team will lose all its place points. If the team forfeits the championship game, they will not receive second place award.
4. Any team who is not represented at the team captains meeting held by the Intramural Office will lose 20 participation points for that activity.

**For co-rec only:** There must be at minimum 2 females to start the game except for dodgeball and softball.

\* A co-rec dodgeball team will consist of eight (8) players – 4 males and 4 females. If the game is started/played with seven (7) players, the numbers can be:

- Four (4) males and three (3) females, or
- Four (4) females and three (3) males.

If a game is started/played with six (6) players, the number of males cannot exceed three (3).

\* A co-rec softball team may only compete with an equal number of male players and female players at all games (i.e., 4 male/4 female, etc.)



## Fraternity Participation

Participation in the fraternity league will be limited to active members of the Interfraternity Council of social fraternities. The specifics concerning the rules and regulations of fraternity participation and eligibility can be secured in the IFC Office located in Kilcawley Center. The fraternity league is completely separate from the Independent All-University Championships. First-place IFC teams will be invited to compete in all University Championship Play-offs.

## Medical Information

**Injuries:** The Intramural Office is not responsible for injuries incurred in the Intramural Program. All participants are advised to carry some type of hospitalization insurance that will cover Intramural injuries. No student with any special health problems or physical ailments which could be aggravated by participation will be allowed to participate. It is strongly advised that each participant has had a recent physical examination. It is each individual's responsibility to provide for his own health protection.

**Accident Report:** A University Accident Report must be completed at the time of injury by the Intramural Supervisor on duty at the game or recreational area for your protection in insurance claims.



## Student Employment Opportunities

Numerous students are employed each year by Intramural Sports in a wide spectrum of jobs. Interested students are urged to contact the Intramural Sports secretary regarding application periods for all positions. Application forms are available in the Andrews Student Recreation and Wellness Center.

Persons selected for the various jobs must have the appropriate personality and skills. In general, any individual applying for intramural employment should have a high level of interest in working with people, an interest in sports, and be available to work evenings and weekends. The available job categories and a brief description of the respective responsibilities follow.

**Sports Intern:** Graduate and undergraduate students are hired to program and supervise all indoor/outdoor competitions. Supervisors have complete authority to deal with any immediate situations that may develop at the activity. The supervisor must know the rules of the game, must be aware of and willing to enforce the rules and regulations governing the program and the use of intramural facilities, and most importantly, must be sensitive to the necessity for honest, unbiased interaction among people.

**Sports Official:** An Intramural Sports official is the foremost individual in the Intramural Sports program. Persons selected for these positions must demonstrate above-average knowledge of the rules and officiating procedures of the game, must be capable of controlling difficult game situations, and, without bias, must be able to enforce the rules of the game. Students interested in becoming officials should contact the Intramural Sports Office at their earliest convenience. Prospective officials should be aware that mandatory training clinics are scheduled prior to each team sport season for clarification of officiating mechanics, rules, and program regulations. In most cases, officials are scheduled for at least two shifts per week.

**Note:** In order to work on campus, students must be full time and in good academic standing.

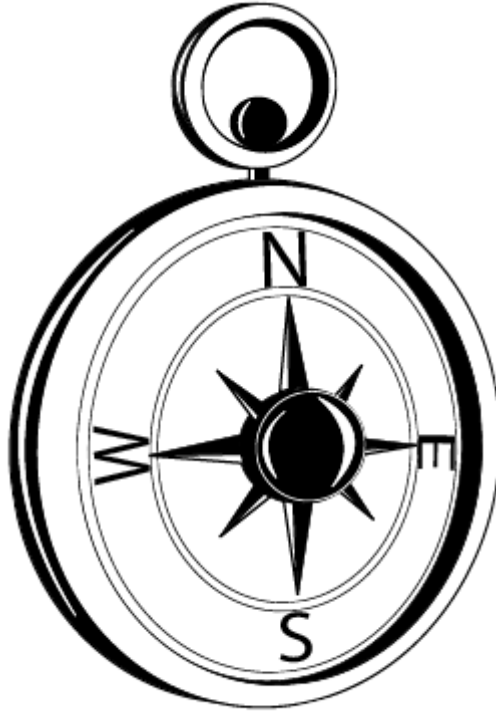
