

What is STAT?

The Student Threat Assessment Team (STAT) is an active group of Youngstown State University staff members who provide resource information to faculty, staff and administrators dealing with students who may be distressed, disruptive, threatening or otherwise problematic.

The following are objectives of STAT:

- Early intervention, support and response to students displaying distressed, disruptive and/or threatening behaviors
- Engage faculty and staff in effective reporting of and response to distressed, disruptive and/or threatening students
- Centralize collection and assessment of “red flag” student behaviors and correlate similar problematic actions to identify the potential for threatening, violent and/or suicidal behaviors while avoiding stigmatization of mental health issues and stereotype-based profiling
- Coordinate follow-up to ensure that resources, support and services are effectively distributed

PROCEED

IMMEDIATELY report via phone

Upon conclusion of immediate action, STAT members will follow up as appropriate and offer support to YSU faculty, staff and/or administrators as needed.

PROCEED

Complete the Student in Distress report from our web site and submit to a STAT member OR report by phone during business hours to any STAT member (You will also be asked to complete the Student in Distress report from our web site).



Report is received by a member of STAT who reviews information and asks any necessary questions for clarification.



STAT members will gather information about the reported student behavior.



STAT will meet and determine appropriate course of action to address the reported student behavior.



Recommendations will be made to appropriate YSU faculty, staff and/or administrators regarding suggested course of action.
